Cover Fewer coins make a better cover

Negative space gets no respect, but without it, positive images have little impact. This spiral-bound cover illustrates how:

Lots of money, no impact Wall-to-wall pile of coins has no negative space and leaves the eye nowhere to look.

Less money, more impact Editing the coins creates shape and difference, makes breathing room and leads the eye to the headline.



100% positive



Delete about half. Note the shape.



Color the negative space.



Place elements.

Our friends' handmade wedding program looked at first like a booklet, but then it opened like an accordion into an unexpectedly classy presentation. Nice.





Our friends said they spent a busy evening assembling these; the homemade charm is part of the appeal.


